

Degree Checklist 2011-2012

This checklist applies to students who are interested in being admitted to Upper Division Status in the David Eccles School of Business beginning in Fall 2011. Students admitted prior to this date should consult the Degree Checklist for their Catalog Year. Students should consult their University of Utah Degree Audit Report each semester. This is an "unofficial" worksheet. Total hours, upper-division hours, and all other graduation requirements should be verified when you apply for graduation (two semesters before your projected graduation date).

Pre-Business Courses

Students wishing to pursue an undergraduate degree at the School of Business take 18 credits of Pre-Business Courses. The Pre-Business Courses are designed to teach subjects and skills that are fundamental to further study in business.

- ☐ BUS 1050-Foundations of Business
- ☐ ECON 2010-Microeconomics or BUS 2010-Microeconomics for Managers or a score of 3 on AP Microeconomics Exam or a score of 5 on the IB HL Economics Exam.
- ☐ IS 2010-Computer Essentials
- ☐ MATH 1090-College Algebra for Business and Social Sciences, or higher level math, or Math 1050-College Algebra¹
Or a score of 3 on the AP Calculus AB or BC Exam or a score of 5 on the IB HL Math Exam. Please consult the Math Department's Math Placement Guide at www.math.utah.edu/ugrad/placement.html or consult with your academic adviser if you have questions regarding this requirement.
- ☐ OIS 2340-Business Statistics or a score of 3 on Advanced Placement Statistics

Upper Division Application

During the final semester of Pre-Business Courses, students must apply for Upper Division Status at the School of Business. The Upper Division Application is available at www.business.utah.edu. Admission is competitive, and applicants will be assessed based on University of Utah coursework, coursework transferred from other institutions, and the overall strength and nature of the applicant pool.

- ☐ Business and Social Science: Select from approved list to be determined; or any two of any of the following courses if taken Spring 2011 or earlier: ECON 2020-Macroeconomics, any three credit Psychology, any 3 credit Sociology, any 3 credit Anthropology.²

Departmental Majors

All students admitted to Upper Division will be considered Bachelor's of Science Business Administration Majors (BSBA). If a student wishes to pursue a degree and major other than BSBA, s/he must apply for admission to a departmental major. A student who wishes to pursue departmental honors should apply for admission to departmental honors at the time that they apply for a departmental major. - ___ American Institutions (AI): Minimum grade D- or CR.² HIST 1700, ECON 1740, or POLS 1100.
- ___ Writing (WR): Minimum grade C-, Writing 2010.
- ___ Quantitative Reasoning (QA): Minimum grade D- or CR.³
- ___ Quantitative Reasoning (QB): Minimum grade D- or CR.³
- ___ Fine Arts (FF): Minimum grade D- or CR.³ 1 of 2.
- ___ Fine Arts (FF): Minimum grade D- or CR.³ 2 of 2.
- ___ Humanities (HF): Minimum grade D- or CR.³ 1 of 2.
- ___ Humanities (HF): Minimum grade D- or CR.³ 2 of 2.
- ___ Physical/Life Science (SF): Minimum grade D- or CR.³
- ___ Physical/Life Science (SF) or Applied Science (AS): Minimum grade D- or CR.³
- ___ Social/Behavioral Science (BF): Minimum grade D- or CR.³ 1 of 2. (waived for Business students)
- ___ Social/Behavioral Science (BF): Minimum grade D- or CR.³ 2 of 2 (waived for Business students)
- ___ Upper Division Communication/Writing (CW): Minimum grade C- or CR.³
- ___ Diversity (DV): Minimum grade C- or CR.³
- ___ Upper Division International (IR): Minimum grade C- or CR.^{2,3}

___ QUANTITATIVE INTENSIVE REQUIREMENT (QI): Students seeking a Bachelor’s of Science must complete the QI requirement by taking two courses from the approved list. FINAN 3040 and FINAN 3050 do count. Minimum grade C- or CR.³

OR

___ BA LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT: Students seeking a Bachelor’s of Arts must complete coursework equivalent to at least a 4th semester (2020 level) competency in either a foreign language or sign language. Minimum grade of C- or CR.³

¹Accounting, Finance, or Operations Management students will also need to demonstrate additional competency in Math with a score of 3 or better on the AP Calculus AB or BC exam or complete Math 1100- Quantitative Analysis or higher level math.

²School of Business Students must also complete two Global Perspectives courses, at least one of which must be a course offered within the School. Courses satisfying the “Business and Humanities” and “Business and Social Sciences” requirement may qualify as Global Perspectives. Consult with your academic adviser.
