## Degree Checklist 2011-2012

This checklist applies to students who are interested in being admitted to Upper Division Status in the David Eccles School of Business beginning in Fall 2011. Students admitted prior to this date should consult the Degree Checklist for their Catalog Year. Students should consult their University of Utah Degree Audit Report each semester. This is an "unofficial" worksheet. Total hours, upper-division hours, and all other graduation requirements should be verified when you apply for graduation (two semesters before your projected graduation date).

## Pre-Business Courses

Students wishing to pursue an undergraduate degree at the School of Business take 18 credits of Pre-Business Courses. ## Upper Division Application

During the final semester of Pre-Business Courses, students must apply for Upper Division Status at the School of Business. The Upper Division Application is available at www.business.utah.edu. Admission is competitive, and applicants will be assessed based on University of Utah coursework, coursework transferred from other institutions, and the overall strength and nature of the applicant pool.

If a student wishes to pursue a degree and major other than BSBA, s/he must apply for admission to a departmental major. A student who wishes to pursue departmental honors should apply for admission to departmental honors at the time that they apply for a departmental major.
